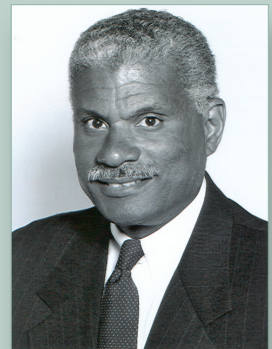

Dr. Courtland Lee is a professor and director of the Counselor Education Program at the University of Maryland, College Park. He is the author, editor, or co-editor of four books on multicultural counseling, three on counseling African-American males, and two on counseling and social justice. Dr. Lee is president of the International Association for Counseling, past president of the American Counseling Association, and a fellow of the British Association for Counseling and Psychotherapy, the only American to receive this honor. He serves as a senior associate editor of the *Journal of Counseling and Development*.
